Free Grant Databases:

1. **Foundation Directory Online (FDO) by Candid:** A comprehensive database offering detailed information on grantmakers and their funding histories. Subscription plans vary, with options tailored to different organizational needs. **Candid.org**
2. **GrantStation:** Provides access to a vast database of U.S. and international funding opportunities, along with tools for strategic grant planning and proposal writing. Memberships are available on an annual basis. **GrantStation.com**
